Sunday 15/10/95: the mass funeral for the boys is aborted after youths claim the bodies have been replaced by 'witchmeat'; second witch - Mrs Giyose - executed; youth leaders arrested...

"Pupils stated they would not allow the burial to take place 'until the souls of the dead have been returned to their bodies." - Kokstad Advertiser.

The bodies are kept on ice for six weeks while sangomas try to locate witches, resurrect the boys, neutralize the witchcraft...

THIRD WORLD BUNFIGHT - which produced 'iMUMBO JUMBO' last year - plunges to the depths of the South African psyche to make theatre to blast us into the next millenium fuelled by the sparks of the colliding cultures of our Third World land. Rehearsing IPI ZOMBI? the company spent two weeks living with sangomas and African mystics in a sacred cave in the hills of the Free State to deeply imbibe the Spirit of Africa, to radiate it with our work. We hope it grips you...

In response to a Mail and Guardian article last year lamenting the lack of real cultural development in Rini Township - in spite of the Festival being held here - I approached the Standard Bank National Arts Festival about starting a township-based performance school to change that. The Standard Bank Foundation granted that wish, and THIRD WORLD BUNFIGHT HQ began its full-time performer-training programme in February. Trainees have also set up drama groups in Rini schools, bringing cultural enrichment to over 120 children twice a week. We have performed at various festivals, and in the streets of the Eastern Cape, and in August are taking Xhosa and English versions of IPI ZOMBI? on an extensive and gruelling tour of urban and rural centres of the province, and up into KwaZulu-Natal.
